
These flyers focus on the pre-race checks and are tailored for both scrutineers and drivers, enhancing our collective understanding and implementation of safety protocols.

For scrutineers: This flyer serves as a comprehensive memo outlining the essential competitor safety equipment checks before events. It highlights key features and expectations to ensure driver and crew safety.



Helmets



Check that the FIA Label and the FIA Hologram are identical to the FIA technical list.



Check if there are cracks on the shell.



Check the presentation form for the accessories.



Check if the foam is cracked or compressed (remove the small liner padding to check the foam).



Cameras are only allowed if FIA approved and presented in the helmet presentation form.



Check that the chin strap is not pinched or damaged (Do not consider the loose part)



Check that the anchorage, bolts and fixations of the visor are operational and undamaged.



Weigh the helmet. Maximum weight: Full face: 1900g Open face: 1700g

Frontal Head Restraint (FHR)



Check that the FIA Label is identical to the FIA technical list.



Check the rubber there should be no damage.




Check the integrity of the material there should be no damage.



Check the straps and fittings - there should be no damage.

For drivers: Designed as a pre-race checklist, this flyer guides drivers through essential safety checks to secure their safety and that of their crew before engaging in competition.



Remember, safety is not just about the equipment but also how it is used. We urge all competitors to carefully read the equipment instructions, all of which have been approved by the FIA Safety Department for their utmost safety.
